Who is a Carer ?



A carer is defined as anyone who looks after or helps support, or intends to look after or support, a family member, a friend or a neighbour without a formal wage. Carers can be any age, ethnicity, gender or from any walk of life. They can also be carers for differing amounts of time and for more than one person at a time. You can be a carer even if the person you care for has not had any formal assessment or been awarded any benefits.

The 2001 Census showed that there are 5.2 million people providing informal care in England and Wales, one in ten of the population.

Did you know, Southampton has an estimated 36,000 carers?

In the UK 42% of carers are men and 58% are women

The economic value of the contribution made by carers in the UK is £119bn per year.

Adult carer

An adult carer is an adult who is caring for another adult such as a spouse, partner, friend or relative.

Three million people in the UK work and are carers ... Could you do it?

Parent carer

An adult caring for an ill or disabled child is a parent carer.

Young carer

A child or young person (aged from 5-25) who's family is affected by caring for at least one family member over and above general just helping out. This could include
